- The judges have the right to transfer to its proper class, any exhibit which has been wrongly entered.
- Lamb's wool will be judged on general type and trueness to type.
- A label must be attached to each fleece showing name of exhibitor and class in which fleece is entered.

## BELGIAN LEMON TEA CAKE

Basic Belgian lemon tea cake recipe - with just the right amount of density and weight, and golden crumbs on top, incorporating that zingy lemon-cake taste.

## Ingredients

## Base

1 cup self-raising flour
$1 / 2$ cup caster sugar
60 g butter
1 egg, lightly beaten

## Filling

1/4 cup lemon juice
$1 / 2$ cup sugar
1 egg, lightly beaten
60 g butter chopped

## Instructions

1. Preheat oven to moderate 180 c .

2. Brush a 17 cm shallow round tin with melted butter and line the base of the tin with baking paper.
3. Sift self-raising flour into a bowl, and add sugar and stir well to combine. Add butter and rub in with finger tip until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Make a well in the centre and stir in egg to form a soft dough.
4. Press $2 / 3$ of the dough into the prepared tin.
5. Pour over hot lemon curd filling. Crumble small pieces of the remaining dough over the lemon curd filling. Bake for 30 minutes and cool tin.
6. To make filling - place all ingredients in small pan. Stir constantly over a low heat until the mixture boils and thickens.
