





- The maximum days growth of wool for all fleeces is 396 days.
- The judge will be advised of days' growth as stated by exhibitors.
- Fleeces from pet sheep are not eligible.
- · Skirted Fleeces must be to the standard recognised by the Selling
- Brokers.
- Fleeces must be rolled.
- The judges have the right to transfer to its proper class, any exhibit which has been wrongly entered.
- Lamb's wool will be judged on general type and trueness to type.
- A label must be attached to each fleece showing name of exhibitor and class in which fleece is entered.

Basic Belgian lemon tea cake recipe – with just the right amount of density and weight, and golden crumbs on top, incorporating that zingy lemon-cake taste.

Ingredients Base

1 cup self-raising flour ½ cup caster sugar 60g butter 1 egg, lightly beaten

Filling

¼ cup lemon juice ½ cup sugar 1 egg, lightly beaten 60g butter chopped

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to moderate 180c.
- 2. Brush a 17cm shallow round tin with melted butter and line the base of the tin with baking paper.
- 3. Sift self-raising flour into a bowl, and add sugar and stir well to combine. Add butter and rub in with finger tip until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Make a well in the centre and stir in egg to form a soft dough.
- 4. Press ⅔ of the dough into the prepared tin.




