STEWARDS – ALL SECTIONS:

Friday Prior to Show Day (1:00 pm – 4:00 pm):

- Collect the Stewards' Box.
- Arrange exhibit cards within the allocated display area.

Show Day Duties:

- Be in attendance by 7:30 am.
- Judging will commence promptly at 9:00 am.
- Receive, classify, and place all exhibits as required.
- Assist the judges by providing award books, prize cards, and ribbons, and ensure they have all necessary support and information to carry out their duties.
- Coordinate among themselves to ensure constant and effective supervision of their section, for the benefit of both exhibitors and the visiting public.
- If necessary, recommend to the Chief Steward the rejection of any exhibit.
- Remain under the authority of the judges during judging and refrain from commenting on any exhibits unless specifically requested.
- Be present in their section at 5:00 pm to oversee the return of exhibits to exhibitors.

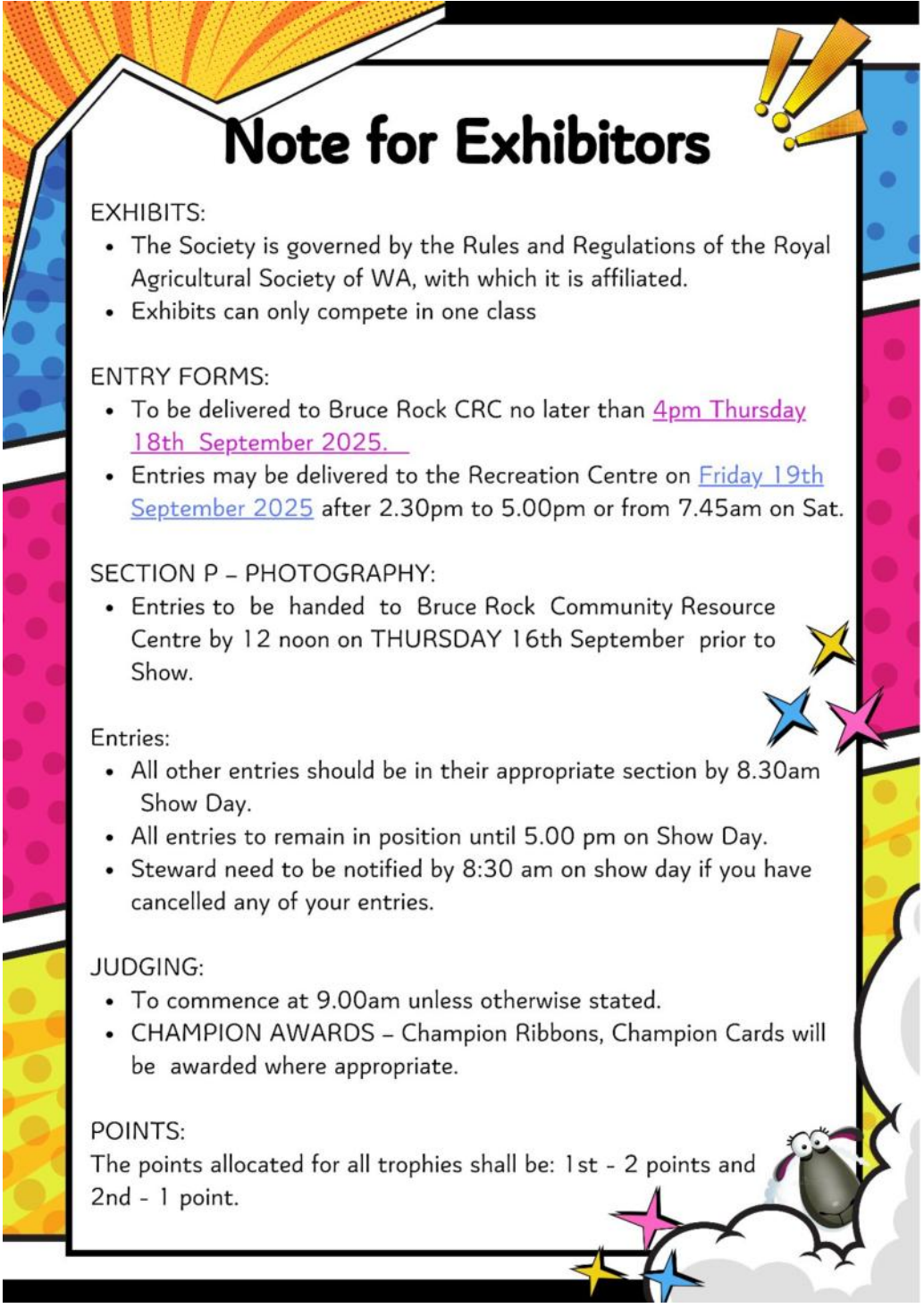

ENTRY FORMS:

- To be delivered to Bruce Rock CRC no later than 4pm Thursday 18th September 2025.
- Entries may be delivered to the Recreation Centre on Friday 19th September 2025 after 2.30pm to 5.00pm or from 7.45am on Sat.

SECTION P – PHOTOGRAPHY:

- Entries to be handed to Bruce Rock Community Resource Centre by 12 noon on THURSDAY 16th September prior to Show.

Notes for Exhibitors of Wool

Section C

- All exhibits must be current season clip.
- The maximum days growth of wool for all fleeces is 396 days.
- The judge will be advised of days' growth as stated by exhibitors.
- Fleeces from pet sheep are not eligible.
- Skirted Fleeces must be to the standard recognised by the Selling Brokers.
- Fleeces must be rolled.
- The judges have the right to transfer to its proper class, any exhibit which has been wrongly entered.
- Lamb's wool will be judged on general type and trueness to type.
- A label must be attached to each fleece showing name of exhibitor and class in which fleece is entered.

HUMMINGBIRD CAKE - AUSTRALIAN WOMANS WEEKLY

Originally from Jamaica and an old fashioned favourite in the southern states of America, this cake is deliciously sweet and moist, packed full of pineapple, banana and coconut

- MP Addison Memorial Trophy for Schedule Cake

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 3/4 cups self-raising flour
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 1/2 cup desiccated coconut
- 1/2 cup walnuts, finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 440g can crushed pineapple, drained
- 2 large over-ripe bananas, mashed
- 2 eggs, lightly whisked
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil

METHOD:

1. Preheat oven to 180° C/160° C fan forced. Grease and line the base and sides of a 21x10cm (base measurement) loaf pan with baking paper, extending paper at long sides for handles.
2. Combine flour, sugar, coconut, walnuts and bicarbonate of soda in a large bowl. Make a well at centre.
3. Combine pineapple, banana, egg and oil in a jug. Add pineapple mixture to flour mixture; stir to combine.
4. Spoon into prepared pan; level surface. Bake for 1 hour or until skewer inserted at centre comes out clean. Cool in pan for 5 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

Hummingbird cake recipe tips and notes

- Bananas: Hummingbird cake is a great way to use up bananas that have gone a bit brown in your fruit bowl and, just like banana bread it's important they are over-ripe. Under-ripe or just ripe bananas (with no brown spots) are harder to mash and have less flavour and sweetness so they won't work as well in the recipe.
- Cooking time will vary. Every oven is different, so set a timer and check with a skewer to make sure the cake is cooked.

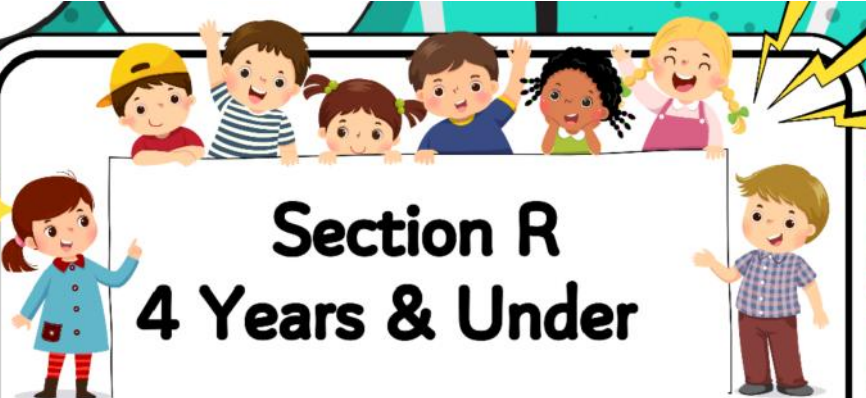

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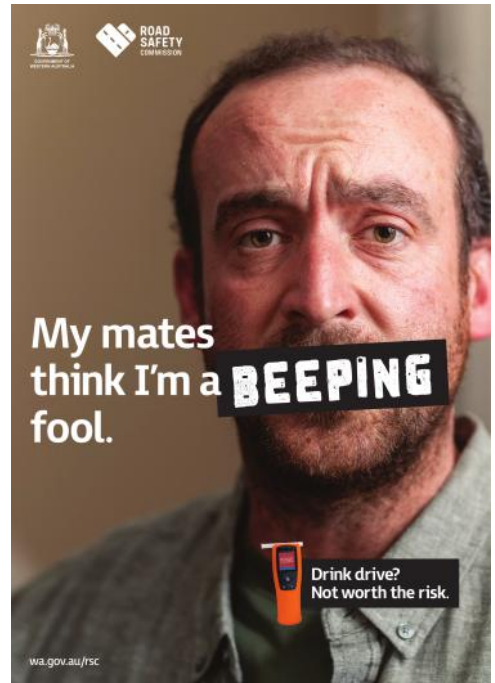
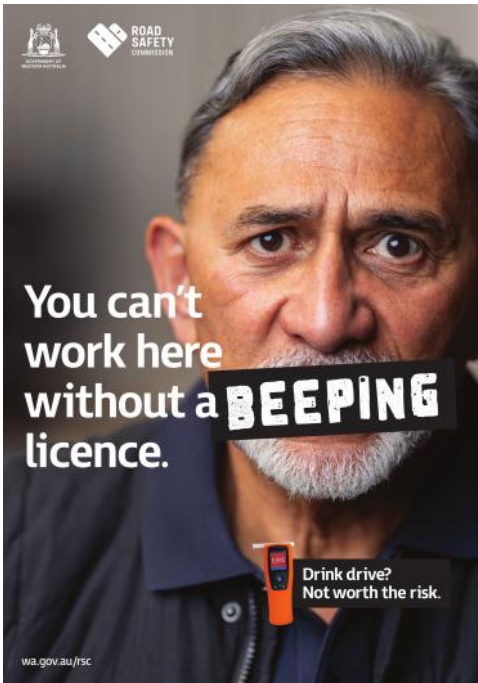
